Duration – 1 day

Overview - This Qualification provides learners with the skills and knowledge to deal with a person having a heart attack or cardiac arrest.

Course Aim

- Understand basic life support requirements
- Be able to demonstrate basic life support techniques and automated external defibrillator use in line with current national guidelines
- Be able to demonstrate post- resuscitation procedures
- Be able to carry out basic user maintenance and troubleshoot problems with an automated external defibrillator
- Understand the safe use of an automated external defibrillator

Duration - 2 days

- administer first aid to a casualty who is unresponsive and breathing normally
- administer first aid to a casualty who is unresponsive and not breathing normally
- administer first aid to a casualty who is choking
- administer first aid to a casualty who is wounded and bleeding
- administer first aid to a casualty who is suffering from shock
- provide first aid to a casualty in anaphylactic shock
- administer first aid to a casualty with injuries to bones, joints and muscles
- administer first aid to a casualty with head and spinal injuries
- administer first aid to a casualty with conditions affecting the eyes, ears and nose
- administer first aid to a casualty with sickle cell anaemia, diabetes, asthma, allergies, meningitis and febrile seizures



- administer first aid to a casualty experiencing the effects of extreme hot or cold
- administer first aid to a casualty who has sustained an electric shock
- administer first aid to a casualty with burns or scalds
- administer first aid to a casualty who has been poisoned
- · administer first aid to a casualty who has been bitten or stung
- administer first aid to a casualty with minor injuries

- administer first aid to a casualty who is unconscious and breathing normally
- administer first aid to a casualty who is unconscious and not breathing normally, including the use of the AED
- · administer first aid to a casualty who is choking

Course Title - First Aid for School and Emergency Life Support **Duration –** 1 day (6 hours)

Overview

Course Aim

- The role of the first aider and assessing the situation
- Contents of first aid kits and avoid cross infection
- Recording of incidents and accidents
- Administer first aid to a casualty who:
- is unconscious child and adult
- requires cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR) child and adult
- is choking child and adult
- is wounded or bleeding
- is in shock
- has minor conditions (minor cuts, grazes and bruises, minor burns & scalds, small splinters, minor bites & stings)
- is having an anaphylactic reaction
- is having an asthma attack
- has a head injury
- has a fracture
